Subj: SDWA Cryptosporidium Certification

Date: January 30, 2014

Laboratories wanting to perform Cryptosporidium monitoring in the State of South Carolina to comply with the Long Term 2 Enhanced Surface Water Treatment Rule (LT2ESWTR) must apply for certification by submitting a complete application package. The application form and required documentation that must be submitted can be obtained from our website at <u>www.scdhec.gov/labcert</u>.

Laboratories seeking certification for Cryptosporidium must apply by **March 3, 2014** so that the application and supporting documentation can be reviewed and certification issued prior to **July 1, 2014.** Failure to submit a complete application package will delay your certification. The laboratory must adhere to the requirements as specified in Chapter 7 of the EPA's *Supplement 2 to the Fifth Edition of the Manual for the Certification of Laboratories analyzing Drinking Water.* (http://water.epa.gov/scitech/drinkingwater/labcert/index.cfm#two).
