
SC Pesticide NPDES Basics Flow Chart & Guide





If an owner is "below" and the owner's for hire applicator is "above", (or visa versa), IPM applies to application.

ABBREVIATIONS: NOI = notice of intent IPM = integrated pest mgt. practices PDMP = pesticide discharge mgt. plan ONRW = outstanding national resource water

MULTIPLE USE PATTERNS?

If you apply pesticides to SC waters, the permit applies to you for each use pattern that would be to SC waters (see definition of "surface waters of the state" in the permit). If you have a use pattern that does not involve an application to SC waters, the permit does not apply to that use pattern. Exceeding the threshold for one use, but not another, only requires IPM/PDMP for use threshold exceeded.
