
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Introduction

In accordance with the South Carolina Administrative Procedures Act, the Department of Health and Environmental Control ("DHEC" or "Department") promulgates new regulations and amends and repeals existing regulations as necessary to execute policy passed by the South Carolina General Assembly. S.C. Code Sections 1-23-10 et seq. If a statute does not require accompanying regulation(s) and is self-executing, the Department generally refrains from promulgating a regulation. Furthermore, the Department does not promulgate regulations that conflict with or exceed its authority as enumerated in governing law.

The Department's promulgation year follows the legislative fiscal year.

The following regulatory activities occurred from July 1, 2017, through June 30, 2018.



Final Regulations

The following DHEC regulations took legal effect during the 2018 fiscal year upon publication in the *South Carolina State Register*. This includes four (4) amendments to existing regulations and one (1) new regulation. Provided below is a summary of the changes made, the effective date, the publication details, and a link to the official text for each regulation.

New Regulation

South Carolina Stroke Care System

Health Regulation

R.61-118

Summary:

Executes the requirements of the Stroke System of Care Act of 2011, S.C. Code Sections 44-61-610 et seq.

Establishes a process of application and recognition of acute care hospitals seeking recognition as stroke centers.

Establishes a statewide stroke registry for collection and analysis of stroke care by acute care hospitals.

Adopts a nationally recognized and standardized stroke-triage assessment tool.

Minimum Standards for Licensing Hospitals and Institutional General Infirmaries

Health Regulation



Summary:

Allows dietitians to prescribe diets and other dietary services.

Incorporates requirements of S.C. Code Sections 44-41-410 through 44-41-480, South Carolina Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act (Act No. 183).

Incorporates existing inspection and construction fees.

Incorporates new safe haven requirements.

New Regulation

Standards for Licensing Crisis Stabilization Unit Facilities

Health Regulation



Summary:

Add new regulation R.61-125 to establish licensure and regulatory requirements for Crisis Stabilization Unit Facilities, which provide a short-term residential program offering psychiatric stabilization services and brief, intensive crisis services to individuals eighteen years of age or older, twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week.

Amendments to Existing Regulations

Summary:

Clarifies the review process to allow sufficient time for affected landowners to understand the Department's methodology in setting jurisdictional lines and erosion rates, and bring any substantiating evidence to the attention of the Office of Ocean and Coastal Resource Management for a staff determination.

Submitted to legislature March 2018.

The Department will not resubmit this amendment for legislative review because the Beachfront Management Reform Act (Act No.

173) addressed the above-mentioned issues.

Summary:

Amend R.61-19 to clarify that the State Registrar may (at his or her discretion) allow other documents to be used for amendment of birth records; increase instances in which names may be administratively added to a birth record; and update the fee schedule.

Retail Food Establishments

R.61-25

Summary:

Amend R.61-25 to incorporate much of the revisions in the 2017 Federal Food and Drug Administration Food Code.

Amend and include inspection fees currently appearing in R.61-37, *Retail Food Establishment Inspection Fees*, which is pending repeal (see page 13). Revise the fee scale based on a process (risk) level or type of establishment and increase fees last updated approximately eighteen years ago.

Amend R.61-56 to add new system standards; clarify and amend definitions; and clarify and update selected sections.

Incorporate amendments of R.61-55, Septic Tank Site Evaluation Fees; R.61-56.1, License to Construct or Clean Onsite Wastewater Sewage Treatment and Disposal Systems and Self-Contained Toilets; and R.61-56.2, Licensure of Onsite Wastewater System Contractors, into R.61-56 through their respective repeals (see page 13).

Amend R.61-62.1, *Definitions and General Requirements*, to expand and improve consistency in language regarding general and registration permits, and update public participation procedures.

Amend R.61-62.5, Standard No. 2, *Ambient Air Quality Standards*, to improve the accuracy and clarity of the text.

Amend R.61-62.5, Standard No. 5.2, *Control of Oxides of Nitrogen (NO_X)*, to update applicability and exemptions.

Amend R.61-62.5, Standard No. 7, *Prevention of Significant Deterioration*, to update applicability and exemptions, and update public participation procedures.

Amend R.61-62.5, Standard No. 7.1, *Nonattainment New Source Review (NSR)*, to improve the clarity and structure of the text, and update public participation procedures.

Amend R.61-62.70, *Title V Operating Permit Program*, to update public participation procedures.

Summary:

Adopt federal amendments promulgated from January 1, 2017, to December 31, 2017, for:

R.61-62.60, South Carolina Designated Facility Plan and New Source Performance Standards

R.61-62.61, National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAP)

R.61-62.63, National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAP) for Source Categories

Amend R.61-62.8, *Chemical Accident Prevention Provisions*, for consistency, clarification, chemical nomenclature, codification, and spelling.

Repeal R.61-62.96, Nitrogen Oxides (NO_X) and Sulfur Dioxide (SO_2) Budget Trading Program, as its requirements have sunsetted and R.61-62.97, Cross-State Air Pollution Rule (CSAPR) Trading Program, replaces these requirements.

Hazardous Waste Management Regulations

Environmental Affairs

R.61-79

Summary:

Amend R.61-79 to adopt the federal "Hazardous Waste Generator Improvements Rule," which will:

- Reorganize the hazardous waste generator regulations to improve their usability by the regulated community;
- Provide a better understanding of how the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act hazardous waste generator regulatory program works;
- Address gaps in existing regulations to strengthen environmental protections;
- Provide greater flexibility for hazardous waste generators to manage their hazardous waste in a cost-effective and protective manner; and
- Make technical corrections to address inadvertent errors and remove obsolete references to programs that no longer exist.

Hazardous Waste Management Regulations Environmental Affairs



Summary:

Amend R.61-79 to adopt the federal "Imports and Exports of Hazardous Waste Rule," which will:

- Make existing export and import-related requirements more consistent with the current import-export requirements for shipments between members of the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development;
- Enable electronic submittal to the EPA of all export and import-related documents; and
- Enable electronic validation of consent in the Automated Export System for export shipments subject to Resource Conservation and Recovery Act export consent requirements prior to exit.

Exempt from General Assembly review.

Neonatal Screening for Inborn Metabolic Errors and Hemoglobinopathies

R.61-80

Summary:

Amend R.61-80 to address storage and usage provisions of the regulation by including a maximum length of time for storage of blood samples; and

Amend to allow for expanding testing to include other congenital disorders or metabolic diseases, while ensuring all testing procedures are in compliance with applicable standards.

Standards for Licensing Facilities That Treat Individuals for Psychoactive Substance Abuse or Dependence

Summary:

Amend R.61-93 for provisions relating to staffing, accident and incident reporting, emergency preparedness, construction, and licensure requirements for facilities that treat individuals for psychoactive substance abuse or dependence.

South Carolina Immunization Registry

Summary:

Amend R.61-120 to allow DHEC to provide specific Healthcare Effectiveness Data and Information Set ("HEDIS") data from the South Carolina Immunization Registry ("Registry") to health plans; and

Amend to detail the availability and use of a new patient portal, clarify patient consent for the new patient portal, and revise the regulation to conform with updates and improvements to the Registry and advancements in public health practice.

Summary:

Repeal R.61-37, as amendments to R.61-25, *Retail Food Establishments*, will incorporate an amended fee scale and fee increase (see page 8). The fee scale currently appears in R.61-37.

Summary:

Repeal R.61-55, as amendments to R.61-56, *Onsite Wastewater Systems*, will incorporate amended definitions, a fee increase, a new expedited permitting process, and service application fees (see page 8). These provisions currently appear in R.61-55.

Summary:

Repeal R.61-56.1, as amendments to R.61-56, *Onsite Wastewater Systems*, will incorporate revised licensing and fee requirements for pumpers and haulers (see page 8). These fees currently appear in R.61-56.1.

Summary:

Repeal R.61-56.2, as amendments to R.61-56, *Onsite Wastewater Systems*, will incorporate a new tiered licensing program (see page 8). The existing licensure system appears in R.61-56.2.

Requirements for State Water Pollution Control Revolving Fund Loan Assistance

Summary:

Repeal R.61-67.1 due to the repeal of its original authorizing statute. The fund is currently effectively administered through another statute; other existing state laws and regulations; and federal laws, regulations, and grant requirements.
