be receiving the vaccine elsewhere. When we first started vaccinations, Charleston County had a low number. However, residents where getting the vaccine in a different Chief Mitchum reviewed the numbers of vaccinations for each county based off of the data on the Dashboard. Do we need to do more to get the information out to individuals? Do we need to promote the Homebound Vaccination Programs? Per Elaine Morgan, is there a way to determine if the issue with vaccines is just in a certain area (such as a rural area)? Per Taylor Lee, he looked at the Dashboard and noticed there is zip code data. However, you aren't able to download the information. Chief Mitchum's concern is that the Orangeburg area may not be getting the attention they need for vaccines. Do we need to focus on a Homebound Vaccination Program instead of the "COVID No More" campaign? Per Chief Mitchum, are the numbers based off of the individuals home zip code or the zip code of the location where they received the vaccine? Per Chief Mitchum, when we look at the zip code data, we are looking at how successful a location is at providing vaccines. Faith Polkey is wondering about whether the information is based on where the vaccine was administered or where the individual lives. She knows that her organization provides the zip code based on the person's residence. Per Taylor, we are looking backwards to see if the zip code that was entered is based off of where the individual lives. The data is updated in the Dashboard as the information is updated/corrected. Unfortunately, there is a loss of interest. We are working now to impact others and encourage others to get the vaccine. We need to encourage our family and friends to get the vaccine. "COVID No More" Do we want to table this campaign until DHEC can turn Targeted Vaccine this data into a table format? Letisha Scotland and Faith Campaign and Panel Polkey agree to table it for now. Per Letisha Scotland, Outreach Collaboration radio ads and marketing to some on Saturdays have been the focus in her area. The spreadsheet would be helpful to Letisha as well.
