Ombudsman Section 43-35-5 Omnibus Adult Protection Act (State Statute)

"In accordance with state statute (R.61-17) and federal regulations (CFR 483.12), please contact your local law enforcement and Ombudsman offices for any questions regarding what and when to report to their agencies."

In addition, the SC Code of Law Section Title 43, Chapter 43-5 is known as the Omnibus Adult Protection Act. It speaks to the authority of the Ombudsman and law enforcement and the requirement of facilities to report.
